The second year of our institution also began with challenges as the pandemic situation continued and the resulting difficulty in reducing the learning gap among the students arising out of missing physical classes. There was uncertainty over when we would be able to get the children back to school. But our team never lost hope. Everyone joined hands and was very determined to overcome the challenges. We made customized digital lessons based on the books that we followed. We shared the same with the students concerned about respective classes through the school mobile app developed by the institution. The parents appreciated the efforts put in by the teachers.

Completing the portion is not enough if it is not able to achieve the desired learning outcomes for all students. Therefore, the teachers worked out a strategy to find out the reading ability of the students at regular intervals. We shared a gaming app with the students to learn basic arithmetic operations in a fun-filled way. Though there are so many applications and gadgets available for the learning process, in the end, it is going to be between the teacher and the taught how best they both make use of the available resources and get motivated to learn. This was well taken care of by our team. We arranged pep talk for the students once a week. Such talks helped us to maintain a balance between academics and non-academics matters. As per the calendar, periodic assessment, terminal assessment, and online tests were conducted. The students' work was evaluated and the assessment report was shared with the parents.

To move away from the monotony of work, we conducted various competitions on the eve of national, religious, and seasonal festivals. Most of them were to kindle the creativity of the students so that they would be able to think differently. Digital certificates are issued to the winners and participants appreciating their efforts. A few students of our school won prizes in the painting competition conducted by the Ministry of power. Our students were also the winners of the District level Chess tournament. Music, art, and physical education classes were conducted regularly.

All teachers attended various training programmes conducted by CBSE, MVM Chennai, the Government of Puducherry, and private publishers on regular basis to update their skills. This in turn helps them work on methodologies followed during online classes. Technology too brought down their workload and reduced the usage of stationaries. It simplified the work of teachers to a greater extent.

There is a plan of expansion of infrastructure facilities available in the campus post-Covid to create more space for classrooms and other activities. Hence the trust passed a resolution to make use of the adjacent building (block A), which belongs to it, with a built-up area of 7837.20 sq. mts for the purpose of expansion of Maharishi Vidya Mandir to Senior Secondary Level.

We value parents' participation in improving the quality of education imparted in the school. There have been frequent interactions between the parent and school. We get valuable input from the parents and we can guide the students properly to fulfil their dreams.
